On the ancient Roman road that went from the Po Valley to Gaul, at the foot of Monte Chaberton, the town of Cesana Torinese stands (1,354 m. above sea level). In a strategic position in the centre of the Alta Val Susa, it is the crossroads of the Vialetta ski area. A municipality rich in history made up of 11 alpine hamlets scattered at an altitude of up to 2,000 meters. The territory is served by hundreds of kilometres of paths and dirt roads of great value: from the ancient paths connecting the villages to roads and military tracks up to the magnificent network of paths that the forestry team of the Piedmont Region has restored or traced in recent years.

NOTE
 The feasibility of the routes is estimated for the period May/October depending on the melting of the snow. Walking time: an average of 3 kilometres per hour has been assumed, adding 10 minutes for every 100 metres of positive difference in altitude.
